months before
implementation.



This means it further delays the data harmonization process in the national dashboard that the Indonesian

government is preparing.



Another regrettable clause is the addition of a "No Risk Category".





Criteria for countries falling under the No Risk Category


- 1. A stable forest area since 1990;
- 2. Compliance with the Paris Agreement and international conventions on human rights and the prevention of deforestation;
- 3. Enforcement of regulations on the prevention of deforestation and forest conservation.



With those criteria, it will be unfair for producent countries such as Indonesia.

By adding the no risk category, it will undermine the EUDR as a whole.





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
